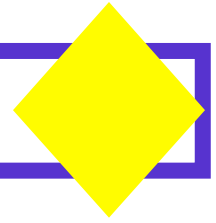

- Metacognition
- Logical Reasoning

Teaching Strategies addressed:

- Reciprocal teaching
- Summarizing
- Content area strategies
